Planting Instructions for: BARE ROOT TREES

Remove all packing materials, carefully untangle the roots and soak the roots in water for 1 hour. Do not allow the roots to dry out.



Dig a hole so the roots can grow outward, spread the roots out in hole. Remove any grass or weeds within a 2-foot circular area.



Plant the tree to the soil line as seen on the base of the trunk, with plenty of room for the roots. Partially fill the hole, firming the soil around the lower roots while adding water at the same time.



Shovel in the remaining soil. It should be firmly but not tightly packed. Construct a water-holding basin around the tree. Give the tree plenty of water.



After the water has soaked in, spread protective mulch 3 inches deep in a 2-foot diameter area around the base of the tree, but not touching the trunk.



The soil and mulch around your trees should be kept moist the first year. During dry weather the first year, generously water the tree every 5-7 days during the first year.



**If planting is not possible with in a day or two, check roots for moisture and store in a dark, cool garage or shed.
